HEALTH STANDARDS

Health surveillance and the prevention of contagious diseases, in the context of Fieracavalli, are carried out by the Veterinary Service of the “Scaligera” Local Health Authority n. 9 of the Veneto Region. Vehicles, vans and railway wagons used and authorized to transport horses must be accompanied by proof of cleaning and disinfection of the vehicle.

Exhibitors must report to the Official Veterinaries operating in the Exhibition Centre any case, even if only suspected, of a contagious disease as indicated in Article 1 of the Veterinary Police Regulations n. 320 dated 8 February 1954 as amended.

HORSES & RELATED ANIMALS

Horses and related animals from territory in Italy entering the Verona Exhibition Centre must be accompanied by an **ID document (Passport) testifying to registration with the National Equine Registry** in compliance with the dispositions of the Decree dated 29 December 2009 and related implementation procedures (Operating Manual as per D.M. dated 26 September 2011) and Legislative Decree n. 29 dated 16 February 2011 (Fines).

All horses and related animals over the age of twelve months will be admitted to the exhibition centre provided they have undergone the checks provided for in the Decree 02 February 2016 National Plan for the Surveillance and Control of Equine Anaemia (OJ General Series No.96 26-4-2016), i.e. they must be for infectious equine anaemia in accordance with the period/validity indicated in the foregoing decree and the results must be annotated on the accompanying documents.

In accordance with the dispositions of Article 31 of Presidential Decree DPR 320/54, the integrated Form IV must be compiled by the consignor in compliance with the dispositions of the Ministry Health Decree dated 28 June 2016 (electronic form IV).

The ID Code of Veronafiere to be indicated on Form IV is: **IT091VR77M**

A copy of this declaration must be given to the personnel of Veterinary Services.

Horses from **Member States of the European Union** must be accompanied by:

- *identification document complying with Regulation (EC) n° 504/2008 of the Commission dated 6 June 2008 implementing Council Directives 90/426/EEC and 90/427/EEC as regards identification methods for horses and related animals in compliance with Directive 156/2009/EC.*

Horses and related animals from **other countries must transit through a Frontier Inspection Point (FIP)** and be accompanied by a **“Common Entrance Veterinary Document” (livestock CEVD)** issued by the FIP.

CATTLE – BUFFALO

Livestock taking part in animal farming events must:

- be accompanied by an individual identification document (passport), which must be presented during health controls (for consequent inclusion in the livestock database) if born before 01/05/2015 or arriving from abroad.

If born after 01/05/2015, livestock must comply with the provisions of Note n° 9384 dated 10/04/2015 issued by the Ministry of Health concerning livestock identification and registration.

- be accompanied by a Declaration of Origin (**integrated Form IV conforming with the provisions of the Decree of the Ministry of Health dated 28 June 2016 (electronic form IV) signed by the Official Veterinarian of the Local Health Authority**) testifying to the favourable outcome of the health visit and any tests performed on animals from farms not subject to official veterinary health measures.

Cattle sent to the exhibition, unless arriving from provinces, regions or states officially recognised as unaffected as per Italian Legislative Decree n. 196 dated 22 May 1999, must have undergone:

“**IBR**” - All animals, in order to access exhibition areas, must satisfy the following requirements:

| • | <i>The relative result must be indicated in section E - Form 4 Inasmuch, admitted animals must be Sero-negative or IgE negative.</i> |

“**BLUE TONGUE**” - Acceptance of livestock from areas affected by restrictive measures will comply with EU Regulation 2007/1266/EC as amended.

TRANSPORT REGULATIONS

Livestock must be transported under the conditions established by Reg. 1/2005 / EC and subsequent modifications and additions and hauliers must exhibit at the entrance to the Fair the certification of the eventual disinfection (Article 64 of Veterinary Police Regulations).

On entry to the Exhibition Centre, all documentation (copy of Form IV, passports, transport authorization) must be presented to the Veterinary Service.

After unloading livestock, vehicles may not leave the Exhibition Centre until they have been washed and disinfected in the specific service area inside the Showgrounds.

PLEASE NOTE:

Reservation is made as regards full compliance with any health regulations that may be issued, from today until Fieracavalli 2018 is held, by the Ministry of Health or the Veneto Region in response to changes in animal farming conditions.
